Slide 1: Cover page (title & 1-2 pictures)

Slide 2: Brief introduction to your topic

- QUESTION 1a: What is your topic about? (Describe with detail and visuals)
- Include at least one picture

Slide 3: Video to introduce your topic to the class (30-45 seconds)

Slide 4: Intro to your topic (cont.)

- Question 1b and 1c: When was it created and popular? AND Where did it come from? Who created it or helped it to become popular?
- Include at least one picture

Slide 5: What's great about this topic?

- Question 2: Why did you choose this topic? (Explain)
- Include at least one picture (this could be a picture of you using/engaging with the topic!)

Slide 6: Audience

- Question 3: Who is the typical audience for it? What type of people enjoy/participate in it?
- Include at least one picture (of people actually listening/watching/engaging with your topic or a stock photo)

Slide 7: Audience (cont.)

- Question 4: What do people think about it? How do we know that? (What evidence can you find that supports this?) (award won, ratings, quotes from critics, etc.)
- Include at least one picture (could be a graph, table, awards, etc. that supports your answer above)

Slide 8: Connections

- Question 5: What was happening historically when this was created/popular? AND How does that history relate to or influence the topic in some way?
- Include 2 pictures (one that relates to the time and the other of your topic)

Slide 9: Video (find a video you find funny, interesting, informative about your topic)

Slide 10: How is this pop culture?

- Question 6: POPULAR: How do we know it's popular? (Include 2-3 pieces of evidence that show that it's popular with a wide range of people.)

Slide 11: How is this pop culture? (cont.)

- Question 6: CULTURE: If you were to analyze it, what message does this send about our society or our values? How is it reflective of people's attitudes, beliefs, norms or values at the time?
