

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Why Study Popular Culture? (Part I)

- I. Why study pop culture? (WATCH: Alexandre Philippe, TedX video)
 - a. He defines what pop culture is and is not.
 - i. What/who is NOT pop culture?

 - b. He says that politics, religion, social issues, cultural values and beliefs are important. On the other end of the spectrum is the "fluff" (pop culture) which goes viral which we typically dismiss as trivial/unimportant.
 - i. In the end, he says we should NOT dismiss pop culture as trivial or unimportant. WHY?
