# **Influential TV Shows Project - SLIDESHOW**

## By now you should have completed the following steps:

STEP 1: FIND SOURCES, RESEARCH & TAKE NOTES

STEP 2: WATCH THE SHOW (Watch one full episode of the show & answer the questions on the "TV Show Review" handout)

## The next step is to create a Google Slides presentation for the class.

Start a Google Slideshow & title it with "your show name, your name"

• My slideshow would be titled "All in the Family, Ms. Shen"

Share your slideshow with Ms. Shen now.

## Your slideshow should follow the following format:

#### Slide 1: Title slide

- Title of your show
- At least one image
- Your name

#### **Slide 2: Details about the show** (question 1)

- Network, years, etc.
- Include one image or interesting background/graphics

### **Slide 3-4: Plot** (questions 2 & 3)

- Storyline, relationships and where the show takes place
- Include at least one picture of the characters

#### Slide 5: Clip of the show

• Find a 2-3 minute clip that you think is a good example of what the show is about (something funny, interesting, etc.)

#### **Slide 5: Audience** (questions 4 & 5)

• Who the show written for & what people thought of the show

• Include at least one picture (of the show, the type of people the show was written for, a graph of audience data, etc.)

#### Slide 6: How the show was alike/different from shows at the time (question 6)

- Was the show like other shows at the time or different? How so?
- Include 2-3 pictures that illustrate what you're comparing it to

#### **Slide 7: Influence/importance of the show** (question 7)

- What made the show unique
- Include at least one image

## Slides 8-9: Historical context/connection

- What was going on in America when it aired (question 8)
- How the show connected to what was going in America & what the show tells us about Americans' values/culture (questions 8 & 9)
- Include at least one picture on each of the slides (the pictures should connect to what you're talking about on each slide)

## Slide 10: Clip of the show

• Find a 30 sec - 2 min clip that is a good example of how the show connects to America, relates to what's happening in the U.S. when the show was on the air, or that shows the time period

#### Slide 11: What shows today are similar to this show (question 10)

• Include pictures of the shows you're comparing it to

Slide 12: Bibliography (paste your source citations here)

# <u>Look over your finished slideshow.</u> I'll be grading you both on how it looks AND the information it includes. Do your best to make it interesting and fun.

- <u>Font</u>: should be readable, at least 16+ point font for notes, and be sure to choose a color that we can read (lighter colors and highlighter colors are hard to read)
- <u>Color/images</u>: you're making a VISUAL presentation, so it should have VISUAL APPEAL. Think
  about what it's like to sit on the other side of this reading/watching it. All slides should have at least
  one picture/video or a visual background. (An all text, black text over white background slideshow
  is boring DON'T DO IT!)
- <u>Videos</u>: you're doing a presentation on a tv show so be sure to include clips of the tv show to support/show what you're talking about AND be thoughtful about the clips you choose. Make them interesting and try to make sure they connect to what you're saying about the show.
