Course Overview - Welcome to Pop Culture!

America is in many ways defined by our popular culture and has been for the past century. Pop culture is all around us, influencing how we think, how we feel, and how we live our lives. Our popular culture not only influences Americans; economically, popular culture has also become our nation's leading export.

In spite of its influence, popular culture is often seen as fluffy or trivial. Academic interest in popular culture is still relatively new. Despite criticism, the field of popular culture is growing and as we will see this year, it *IS* worth studying.





Over the course of the year, we'll study topics ranging from celebrities & icons to music and social media. We'll also spend time talking about tv, art, sports, dance, fashion and technology. All of these topics can't be divorced from the history and events happening in that time so you will need to draw on your knowledge of the various decades of the 20^{th} century (no worries though, we'll review the relevant details at the start of each unit!)

In a world that is increasingly saturated with media, you need to be savvy consumers of popular culture. This course will draw on your own experience as consumers of popular culture as a starting point for exploring the various roles popular culture plays in our lives.






